

BE IT REMEMBERED THAT I, CHARLES W. BARKER, of Gray, in the County of Cumberland and State of Maine, being of lawful age and of sound and disposing mind and memory, do hereby make, publish and declare this to be my LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT, hereby revoking any and all former wills made by me.

FIRST: I nominate and appoint MATHEW G. MORRILL of said Gray sole Executor of this Will and request that no bond be required of him in said capacity.

I direct my said Executor to pay all my just debts, funeral expenses and expenses of administration as soon as convenient after my decease.

SECOND: I give and bequeath to the Gray Cemetery Association the sum of ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100.00) for the purpose of providing perpetual care of my cemetery lot, provided I have not attended to the same during my lifetime.

THIRD: I give, bequeath and devise my home property in said Gray to my nephew, MARTIN E. BARKER.

FOURTH: I give and bequeath all of the furniture, furnishings, fixtures, equipment and all other items of personal property in and about said home property to my said nephew, MARTIN E. BARKER.

FIFTH: I direct my said Executor to sell and dispose of all of my property not herein specifically bequeathed or devised and to turn all of my estate not so bequeathed or devised into cash, as soon after my decease as he can reasonably do so to the best advantage of all concerned. I authorize and empower him to make such sales and to execute and deliver all necessary instruments to accomplish the same without obtaining any license therefor from the Probate Court.

After my said estate has been converted into cash, I give and bequeath and devise the same, together with the proceeds of any policies of insurance on my life which are, or may become, not payable to a named beneficiary, as follows:

A- One-third ($\frac{1}{3}$) thereof to the United Baptist Convention of Maine, the same to be safely invested and to be held separate from all other funds held by it. Said United Baptist Convention shall, at all times, retain one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the income from said fund and add the same to the principal of said fund. It shall pay the other one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of said income to and for the use of the FIRST FREE BAPTIST CHURCH of Gray, Maine, provided said church is exclusively an active member of said United Baptist Convention of Maine. If said First Free Baptist Church of Gray should cease to be such an active member, said one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the income from said fund shall be used by said United Baptist Convention of Maine for missionary work. Said United Baptist Convention of Maine shall have the right to deduct from the income from said fund the amount of one dollar (\$1.00) per year for its postage and services.

B- Two-thirds (2/3) to the Inhabitants of the Town of Gray, Maine, the sum to be safely invested and to be held separate from all other funds held by said Town of Gray. Said fund shall be under the management of the Selectmen of said Town, who shall, at all times, retain one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the income therefrom and add the same to the principal thereof. The other one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the income from said fund shall be used to pay annual scholarships of ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$ 100.00) each to worthy citizens of Gray to assist them in obtaining a college education at the college of their choice.

Said Selectmen shall annually, as soon as possible after their election, select a committee of four reliable citizens of said Town of Gray to receive, consider and process applications for such scholarships and to recommend to said Selectmen such persons as they deem worthy of receiving such scholarships, and first consideration shall be given to the persons so recommended. No member of such committee shall be a member of the school committee which is responsible for the operation of the schools of said Town. Such committee members shall serve until a similar committee shall have been appointed or reappointed after the next selection of a Board of Selectmen of said Town. If any of them should die, resign or cease to be citizens of the Town of Gray, the Selectmen shall appoint a new member of the committee to replace him or her.

If, at any time there should not be sufficient applicants for the scholarships then available, said selectmen may award more than one scholarship to any applicant found worthy of receiving the same, having in mind that such additional scholarships are to be awarded only in the event that such award will not deprive some other worthy applicant of the privilege of receiving one.
