Gray is a quintessential New England town, full of history and charm. A four season destination with lakes, hiking trails, cross country skiing trails, golf, and antique shops, Gray has something for everyone!

Gray is easily accessible via five State roads and Exit 63 on the Maine Turnpike. Although Gray is a small community, almost 40% of Maine's population is within a 30 mile radius. Portland, Lewiston/Auburn, Brunswick and Freeport are just minutes away.

Gray is home to over 200 businesses ranging from a local ice cream shop to a state-of-theart prototype manufacturing facility located in the Northbrook Business and Industrial Park.

Education

The Gray-New Gloucester (MSAD15) school district is one of only three in the State to have earned an International Baccalaureate (IB) designation, in addition to, national recognition for the successful transition to performance based learning.

With over a 96% high school graduation rate, students may opt for the standard course of study or participate in the intensive two-year IB program during the junior/senior years.

Workforce

Gray has an educated work force with over 25% of residents holding a bachelor's degree or higher. Within a 30 mile radius of Gray, businesses can draw from a labor force of over 300,000.

As of 2011, Gray's median household income was \$69,848, ranking 6th out of 29 communities in Cumberland County. The State's median household income is \$47,898.

Quality of Life

The slogan in Maine is "The Way Life Should Be" and Gray is no exception.

Visitors and residents enjoy pristine lakes, hiking trails, the Wildlife Park and a premier golf course.

With over 60% of households consisting of families, Gray is the perfect place to call home.

Gray continues to see a rise in co-curricular sports activities and family events, such as the Patriot 5K race, Crystal Lake Ice Derby and the Soccer Crossroads Challenge.

The Maine Wildlife Park has called Gray home for 80 years and draws 100,000 visitors annually.


