# Town Government Prepares Revised FY24 Budget for September Vote

The Gray Town Council and Town staff have been working to present a new FY24 budget to voters following the rejected proposed budget in the June election.

Approximately one thousand residents voted in June. While some budget articles passed, the municipal budget appropriation and the property tax levy limit override failed to pass, resulting in necessary budget revisions and a re-vote. You can view all June referendum results on our <u>website</u>.

To revise the budget to meet residents' needs and the needs of our growing community, the Town Council is holding workshops to discuss how the budget can be reconsidered. Like with the originally proposed FY24 budget, the Town Council prioritizes transparency in the budget creation process; therefore, you can watch any of the revised FY24 budget workshops, and view any related documentation, on a <a href="webpage">webpage</a> created specifically for this revision process.

The process for revising the FY24 budget is as follows:

- The first revised budget workshop was held on **July 13**. You can watch that video <u>here</u>.
- The second workshop was held on July 20, and is watchable <u>here</u>.
- A third budget workshop will be held on August 3 at 6 p.m. in the Henry Pennell Municipal Complex and on Zoom.
- A fourth workshop will be held on August 7 at 5 p.m. in the Henry Pennell Municipal Complex and on Zoom.
- The Town Council will then hold a **special meeting in August** (date TBD) to approve revised warrant articles. You can view those warrant articles on the aforementioned webpage when they are available.

After the warrant article meeting, the revised budget will go to an inperson Town Meeting in September. This Town Meeting will follow rules set by <u>state statute</u>.



Any registered Gray voter can vote in this special Town Meeting. Please know only registered voters in attendance can cast a vote on the revised budget. When they are available, details about the Town Meeting can be found on our <u>website</u>.

Gray residents and property owners can bring their hazardous household materials to the Town of Gray Sand and Salt Shed on Seagull Drive in Gray on Saturday, August 19, 2023, from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. Proof of residency will be required. Acceptable materials include, but are not limited to:

- Acids (Muriatic, Sulfuric)
- Ammonia
- Automobile cleaners
- Bleach
- Boat and automobile paints
- Carburetor cleaner
- Chrome polish
- ...And many more!

- Wild Blueberry Festival Committee: Celebrates and promotes local businesses, community and school organizations, and the Pennell Complex.
- <u>Community Economic Development Committee</u>: Promotes community and cultural connections in Gray and supports established businesses.
- <u>Community Television Advisory Committee</u>: Makes recommendations regarding broadcast options for Gray, and recommends improvements to public, educational, and governmental programming.
- <u>Dry Mills School House Committee</u>: Preserves the rich history of the Dry Mills School House.

- Open Space Committee: Makes recommendations to the Town

- <u>Zoning Board of Appeals Committee</u>: Hears and decides administrative appeals where it is alleged there is an error in any order, requirement, decision, or determination by the Code Enforcement Officer.
- MSAD #15 School Board: Shapes the functioning of the Gray-New Gloucester school system.
- <u>Recreation Committee</u>: Advises and recommends to the Town Council on recreational and public parks matters, such as: programs, policies, development, and leisure time activities.
