Town Leadership Looks Forward to Village Gateway Planning and Public Input

In 2020, Gray citizens approved a Comprehensive Plan, the Town's

"blueprint" for the next 10 to 20 years, which provides policy guidance for a host of elements, including protection of natural habitats and directing where future residential and commercial development will occur.

In 2021, the Town

had an opportunity to bring the Comprehensive Plan's vision to life by acquiring a seven-acre parcel located at the center of town. On June 8, Gray residents voted in support of the acquisition of this Village Gateway parcel, which will now feature largely in the strategic planning process for the long-term viability of the Gray Village. The parcel has the potential for not only sports fields, but also to further the Comprehensive Plan's goal of reshaping the Village as a more attractive environment for new business and real estate investment.

Town staff will soon present recommendations for the FY23 budget year that include project proposals for linking Town Hall and Newbegin Gym to the Village Gateway parcel (pictured above) via expansion of the Town's trail system and construction of recreational facilities. We hope that stakeholders and citizens will view these proposals in relation to the Village Gateway parcel acquisition and the Comprehensive Plan's goal of creating and maintaining additional off -street trail networks.

The Town Council will host public sessions to discuss the short- and long-term vision for the Village Gateway. We will share times and dates of those public sessions when they are decided.

Libby Hills Trails

Agreement Reached

The Town of Gray, MSAD 15 School District, and Gray Community Endowment are pleased to announce the approval of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the Libby Hill Trails system located at the end of Libby Hill Road.

The result of a years-long effort to create a partnership between the three owner entities, the MOU will allow for the creation of an updated Forestry Management Plan, a long-term maintenance plan, and a fully developed Capital A section of the Libby Hills Trails system Investment Plan.



Libby Hill Trails has become a central, highly utilized recreational gem over the years. The school district uses the trails for athletics – cross country track and Nordic skiing - creating a premiere location for Maine middle school and high school athletic meets and championships. In addition, the trails host classes, school projects, field trips, and Nonstop Nordic Races, among other things.

PSA: Being Safer in the Winter

Slips, trips, and falls are all-too-common in the winter. These tips can help you be safer while walking outside.

- Walk slowly, and point your toes out slightly to be more stable.
- Walking like a penguin is a safer way to get around on ice and snow.
- Don't text or read while walking.
- Don't take shortcuts over snow piles.
- Remove snow and water from shoes when entering buildings.
- Don't rush! Give yourself extra time in winter weather.

Shaker Road Receives Improvements

Shaker Road, the road that links Main Street with Route 26A, is one of the most heavily trafficked areas in Gray. Recognizing that residents view traffic issues as a threat to their quality of life, one of the goals of the Town's 2020 Comprehensive Plan was "to address current transportation infrastructure needs to manage traffic and ensure safety of residents and visitors."

As a sign that the Town is working toward this goal, we are pleased to share that the Shaker Road sidewalk and drainage project is now complete. The project includes both sides of the road from Main Street to Chipman's Farm Stand. 28 drainage basins and four outfall pipes were replaced, more than 5,200 feet of aging sidewalk was reconstructed and widened, and about 860 feet of new sidewalk was added to the west side of the road going north. These sidewalks (including all road and driveway crossings) are now compliant with Americans with Disabilities Act standards.

This project, which ran from March to October 2021 and is on track to come in at or under budget, has only a few items remaining for this spring, including review of adequate grass cover, addressing any remaining paving or drainage concerns, and replanting trees at appropriate viable locations. The project was only possible thanks to funding from both the Town and the Maine Department of Transportation, and the efforts of those involved in the construction work.

Upcoming Nordic Races at Libby Hill

It's the season for some awesome ski races! Skiers can participate in Nonstop Nordic, a club of Nordic skiers comprised of all ages and abilities.

Middle and high school races are always after school, and the Nonstop Nordic races are on Sundays. Course prep begins the night before and organizers ask that people stay off the course during the race to avoid any mishaps or interference. Each of the Nonstop races will have a professional announcer broadcasting the race and keeping the action lively.






<u>Blueberry Festival Committee</u>: Celebrates and promotes local businesses, community and school organizations, and the Pennell Complex.


