Eagle Scouts go through a rigorous set of guidelines that are required to complete any Eagle Scout project. The planning, development, and demonstration of leadership must be presented to the Boy Scouts of America district board. Then the scout needs to implement a plan that includes reaching out to the beneficiary of the project, propose a plan, and then present the project to the Gray Town Council for their blessing. Next steps are to acquire permits that might be needed, propose fundraising ideas, seek donations, work closely with the Town of Gray Building & Grounds Department, coordinate volunteers, buy materials, assign jobs and finally complete the project.

<u>Blueberry Festival Committee</u>: Celebrates and promotes local businesses, community and school organizations, and the Pennell Complex.

<u>Community Economic Development</u> <u>Committee</u>: Promotes community and cultural connections in Gray and supports established businesses.

<u>Community Television and Communications</u> <u>Advisory Committee</u>: Makes recommendations



regarding broadcast options for Gray, and recommends improvements to public, educational, and governmental programming.

Dry Mills School House Committee: Preserves the rich history of the Dry Mills School House.

Library Trustees: Adopts policies related to the library's operation and planning.

<u>Open Space Committee</u>: Makes recommendations to the Town Council to help secure access to land/corridors through acquisitions, easements, land swaps, and other forms of agreements.

<u>Planning Board</u>: Reviews and approves subdivision plans, site plans, conditional uses, and Shoreland Zoning applications in accordance with State Statutes and Town Ordinances.

Recreation and Conversation Committee: Advises and recommends recreational and public parks matters to the Town Council, such as programs, policies, development, planning, or leisure activities.

<u>Resiliency Committee</u>: Promotes climate action planning and related actionable items.

Zoning Board of Appeals Committee: Hears and decides administrative appeals where it is alleged there is an error in any order, requirement, decision, or determination by the Code Enforcement Officer.
