Prepare for Election Day!

Election Day is just around the corner! Are you prepared for November 8? Here are some things you can do to make sure you are informed as you go to the polls.

- 1. Know where the polling place is. All residents of Gray can vote at the **Newbegin Gym in the Henry Pennell Municipal Complex at 20 Main Street in Gray**. The polls are open from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m.
- 2. Familiarize yourself with who your current elected officials are. You can use the <u>Maine Voter Information Lookup Service</u> to do this. If you have a question about your voting eligibility, please contact the Town Clerk's Office.
- 3. Check out the <u>sample ballots</u> so you know what to expect in the polling booth. This year, you'll be voting for governor and State House and Senate representatives, among other positions.
- 4. Watch the <u>State House/Senate Candidate Forum</u> hosted by the Town of Gray so you can get to know the candidates you'll be voting to represent you in Augusta.
- 5. You can also watch an <u>Election Integrity Forum</u> that was held at the Gray Public Library recently and featured Maine Secretary of State Shauna Bellows. *Note: This forum was unaffiliated with the Town of Gray.*

If you can't make it to the polls on Election Day, you can vote at any time before November 8 by coming to the Gray Town Office at 24 Main Street during business hours and filling out a ballot. Please note the Clerk's Office in the Town Office will be closed on Election Day.

Election results will be calculated soon after the polls close on November 8, and will be available online at graymaine.org/elections.




Town of Gray FY22 Annual Report Now Available
