

## 23rd Annual Crosstown Challenge to Attract 111 Soccer Teams, Thousands of People to Gray

The Crossroad's Challenge is a two-day soccer tournament held over Indigenous Peoples' Day Weekend, October 7-8, 2023, for boys' and girls' "classic" teams ages U9-U14.

U9 and U10 teams will play three games each either on Saturday or Sunday. U11 teams will play three games spread out over Saturday and Sunday. U12-U14 "competitive" teams will play a minimum of three games with the opportunity to advance to the championship game.

Make sure to visit the student- and parent-run booths at the high school to enjoy a classic snack shack menu, including pulled pork, loaded baked potatoes, and donuts, along with face painting, hair spray, and much more! At the event, they will also have a clothing drive for the G-NG Caring Closet and a food drive for the G-NG Backpack Program.


### November Election Worker Applications Now Open

- <u>Resiliency Committee</u>: Promotes climate action planning and influences the path our community will take toward climate resilience, energy efficiency, waste management and renewable energy.
- Zoning Board of Appeals Committee: Hears and decides administrative appeals where it is alleged there is an error in any order, requirement, decision, or determination by the Code Enforcement Officer.
- MSAD #15 School Board: Shapes the functioning of the Gray-New Gloucester school system.
- Recreation Committee: Advises and recommends to the Town Council on recreational and public parks matters, such as: programs, policies, development, and leisure time activities.
